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Demographic Profile

The population in Jefferson County, Illinois was 36,808 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022.

The region has a civilian labor force of 17,232 with a participation rate of 58.4%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Jefferson County, Illinois, 18.5% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 36.5% in the nation.

The median household income in Jefferson County, Illinois is \$61,102 and the median house value is \$118,400.

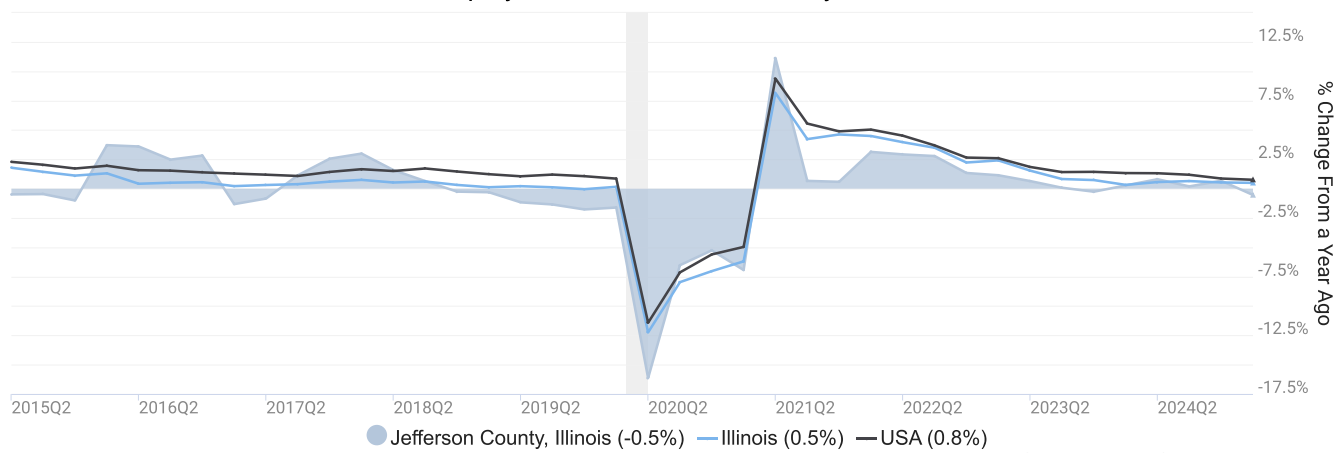

Employment Trends

As of 2025Q1, total employment for Jefferson County, Illinois was 20,599 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2025Q1, employment declined 0.5% in the region.

Employment for Jefferson County, Illinois

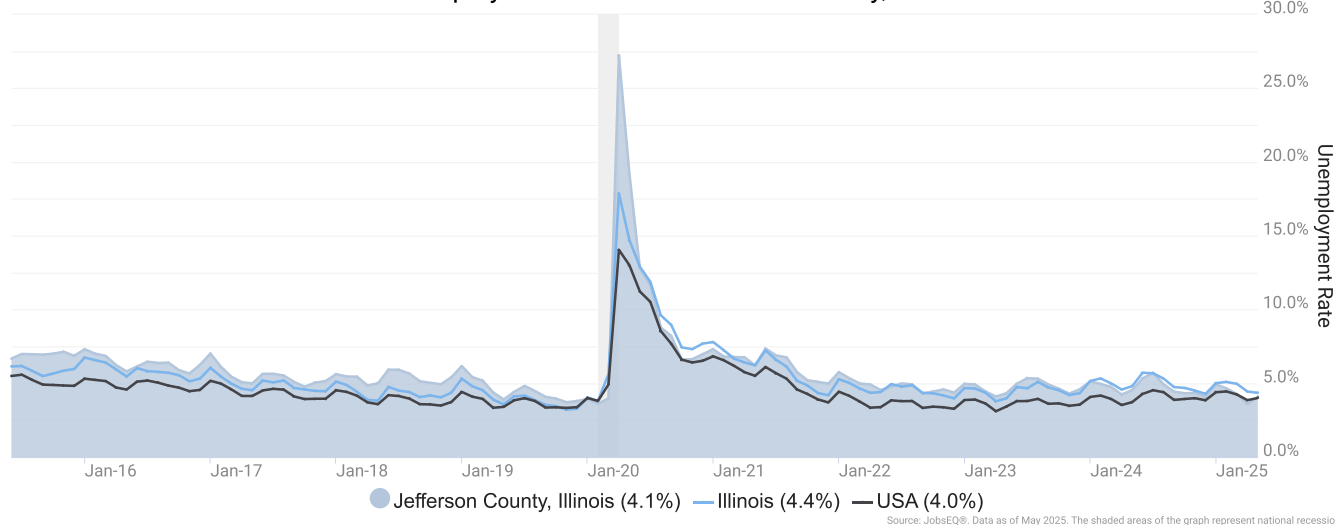

Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for Jefferson County, Illinois was 4.1% as of May 2025. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.0%. One year earlier, in May 2024, the unemployment rate in Jefferson County, Illinois was 4.6%.

Unemployment Rate for Jefferson County, Illinois

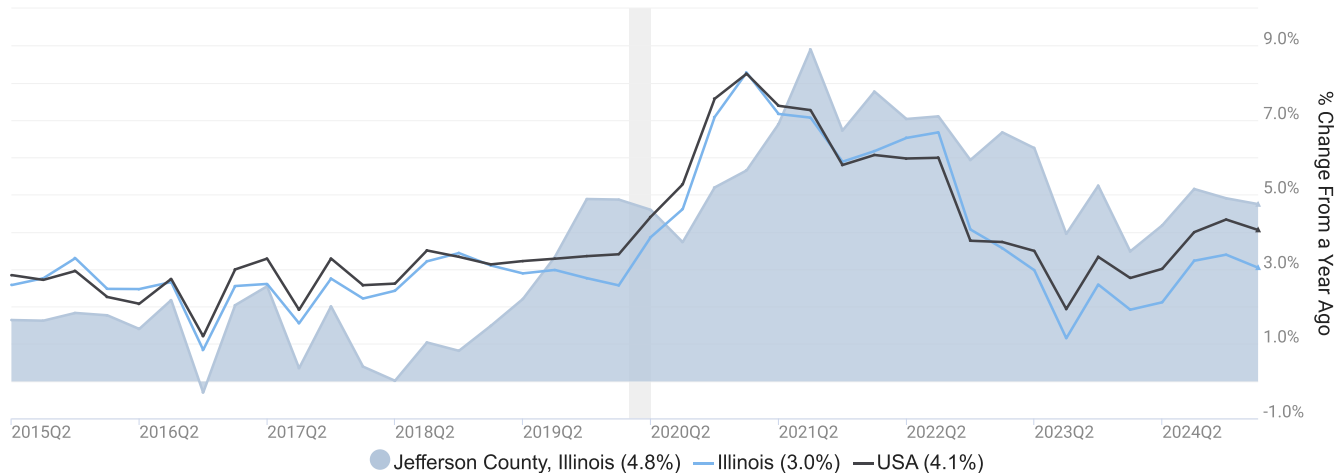

Wage Trends

The average worker in Jefferson County, Illinois earned annual wages of \$56,461 as of 2025Q1. Average annual wages per worker increased 4.8% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$74,181 in the nation as of 2025Q1.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 14.7% lower in Jefferson County, Illinois than the U.S. average.

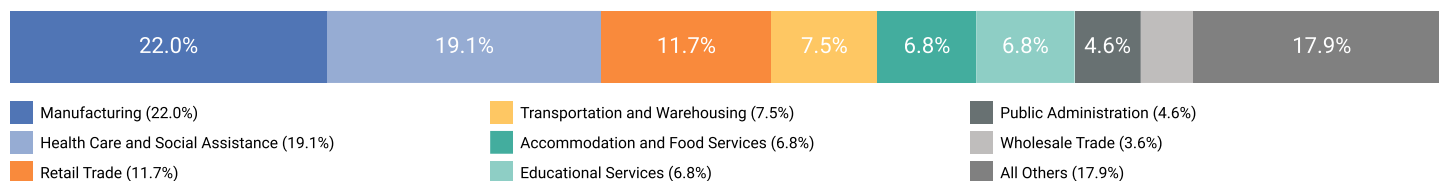

Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in Jefferson County, Illinois is Manufacturing, employing 4,529 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Health Care and Social Assistance (3,939 workers) and Retail Trade (2,408). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Manufacturing (LQ = 2.81), Transportation and Warehousing (1.49), and Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (1.46).

Sectors in Jefferson County, Illinois with the highest average wages per worker are Utilities (\$117,307), Finance and Insurance (\$88,064), and Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (\$76,860). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Health Care and Social Assistance (+463 jobs), Manufacturing (+274), and Public Administration (+80).

Over the next 1 year, employment in Jefferson County, Illinois is projected to contract by 123 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +0.0% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (0 jobs), Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (0), and Utilities (0).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Jefferson County, Illinois is Production Occupations, employing 2,975 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (2,424 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (1,875). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 2.68), Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (1.37), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (1.34).

Occupation groups in Jefferson County, Illinois with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$110,600), Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$105,700), and Legal Occupations (\$102,200). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.4% among Legal Occupations to 8.3% among Production Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Jefferson County, Illinois is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +0.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+2 jobs) and Community and Social Service Occupations (+1). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Production Occupations (311 jobs) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (303).

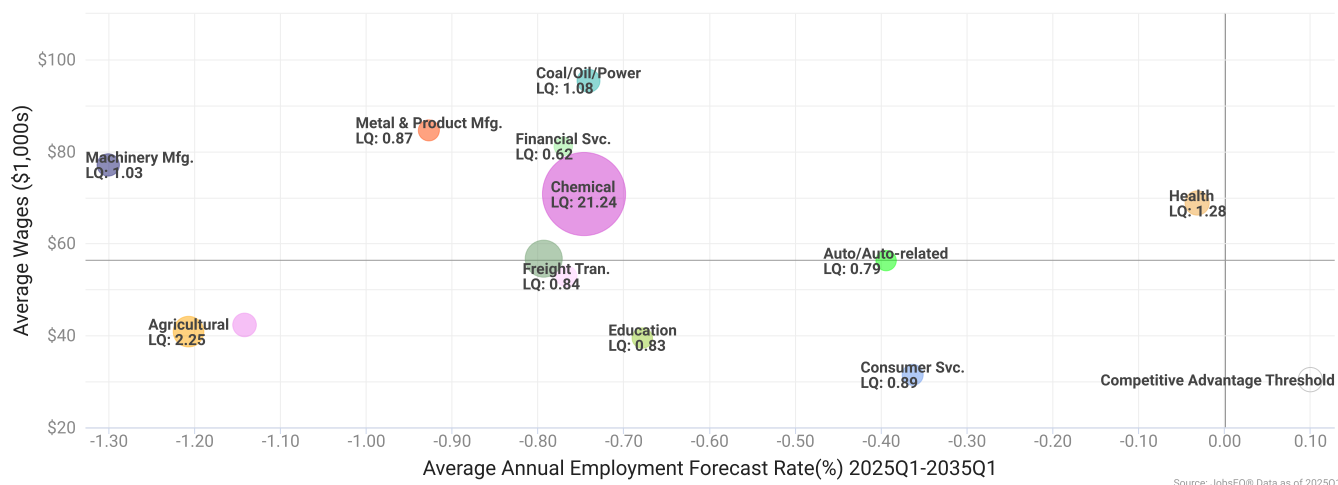

Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Wages by occupation are as of 2025 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Jefferson County, Illinois with the highest relative concentration is Chemical with a location quotient of 21.24. This cluster employs 3,824 workers in the region with an average wage of \$70,761. Employment in the Chemical cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.7% per year over the next ten years.

Industry Clusters for Jefferson County, Illinois as of 2025Q1

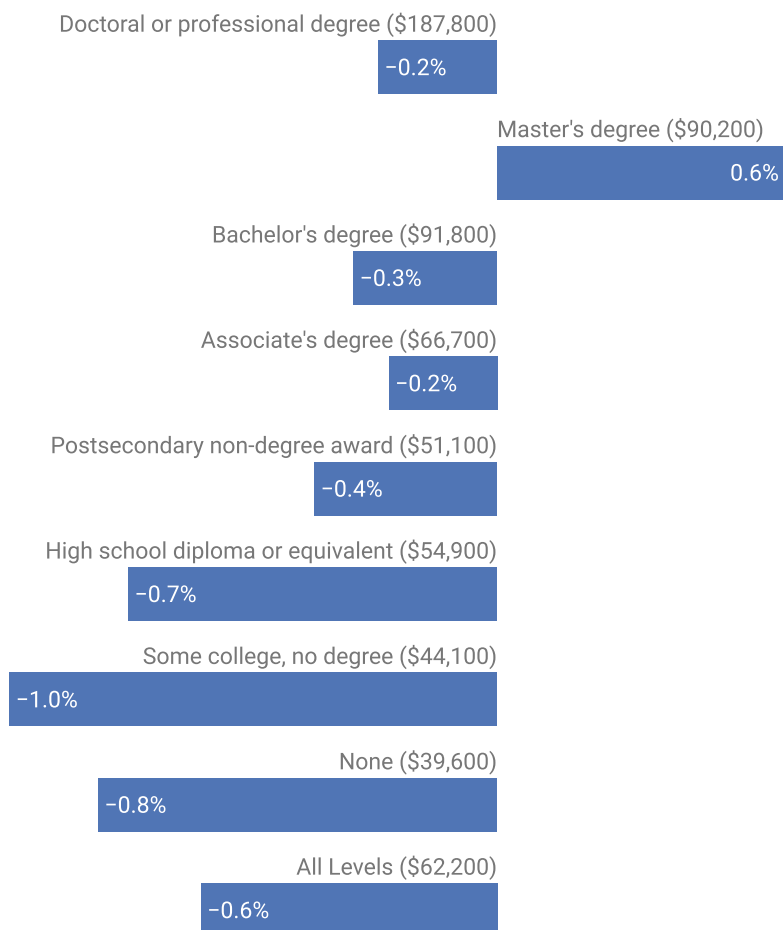

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Jefferson County, Illinois is projected to contract 0.6% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to contract 0.2% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 0.3% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to contract 0.2% per year.

Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

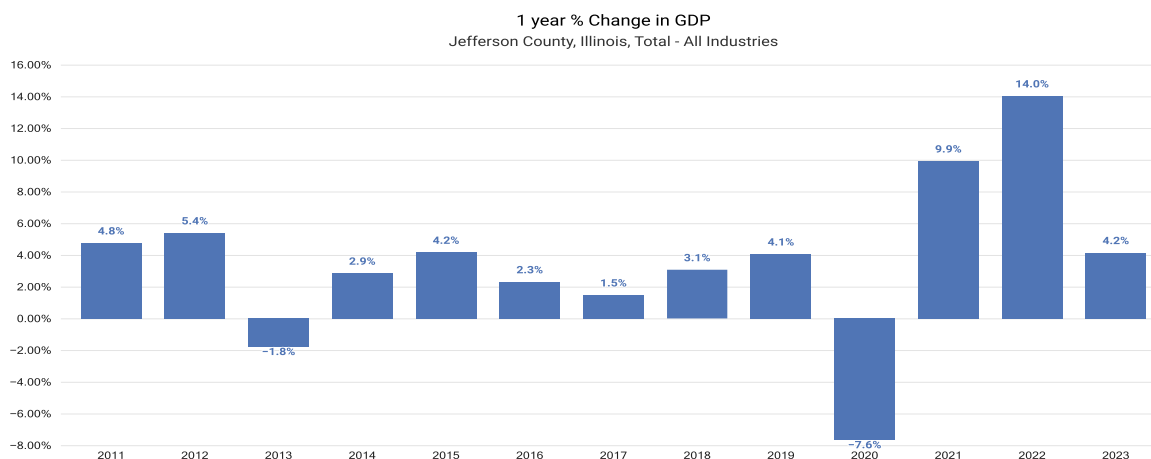

Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2023, nominal GDP in Jefferson County, Illinois expanded 4.2%. This follows growth of 14.0% in 2022. As of 2023, total GDP in Jefferson County, Illinois was \$2,333,411,000.

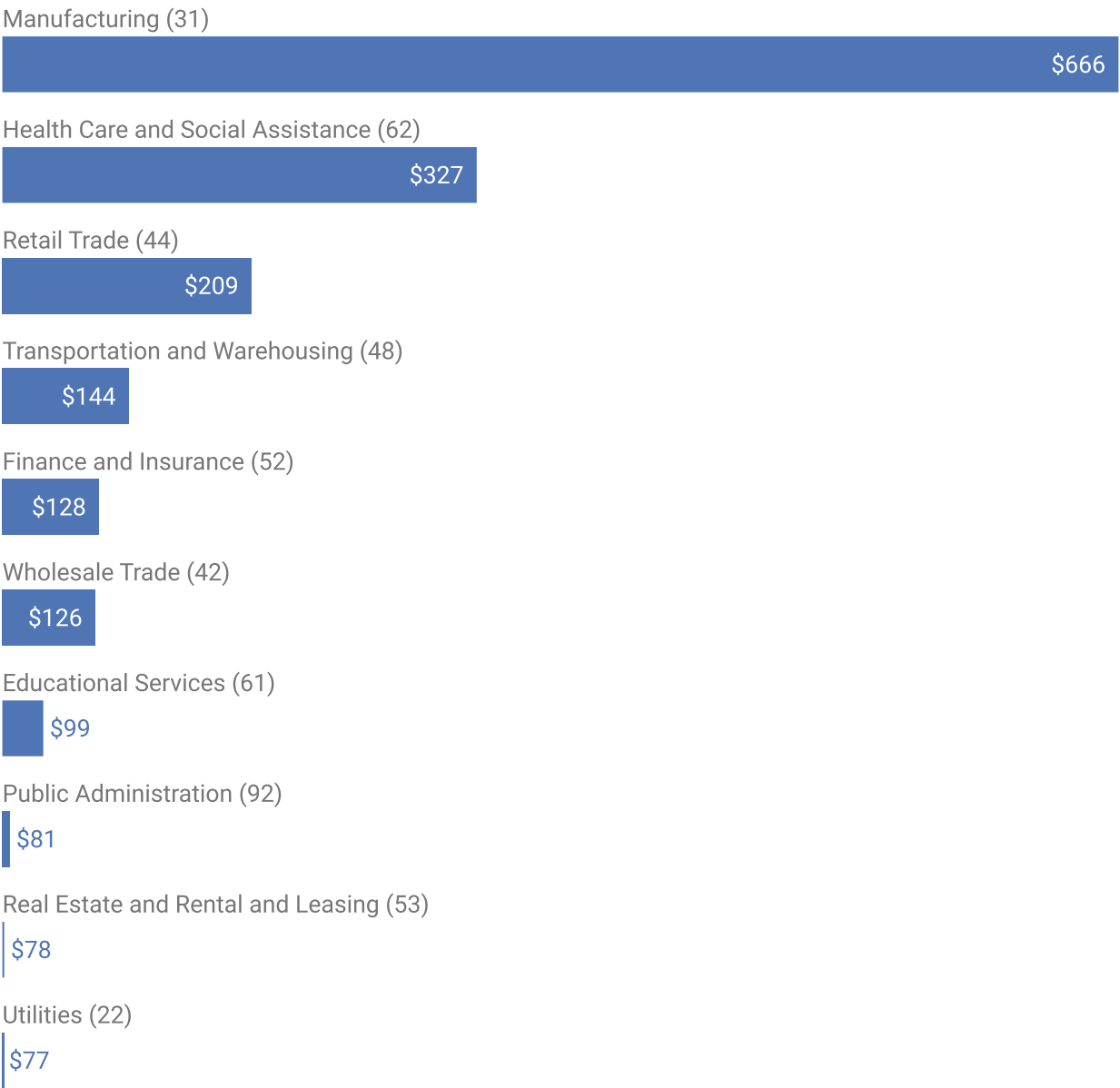

Of the sectors in Jefferson County, Illinois, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2023, \$665,871,000. The next-largest contributions came from Health Care and Social Assistance (\$326,886,000); Retail Trade (\$209,065,000); and Transportation and Warehousing (\$144,264,000).

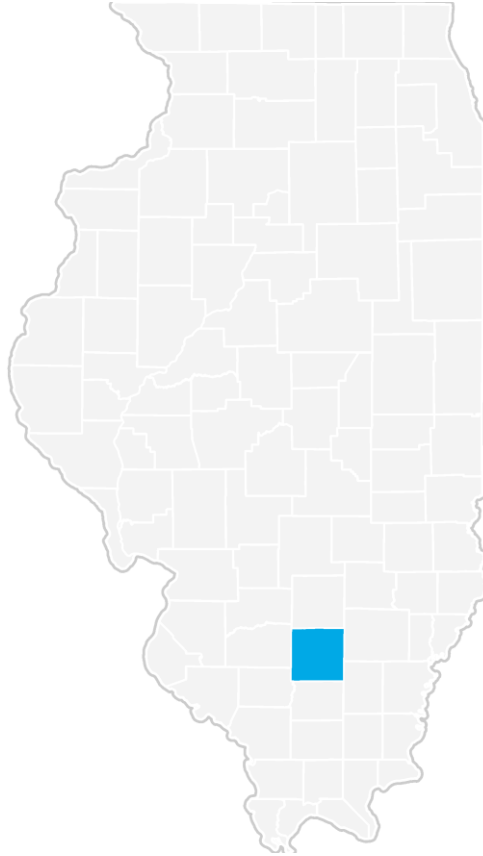
GDP (in \$ millions)

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the “all industry” level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the “sector,” which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.

About This Report

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
